Dear Parents and Carers.

This week I met with headteachers from other local schools. It is always good to catch up and support one another. I am always happy to return to our lovely school afterwards!

Interestly during the meeting we heard from an organisation called Smartphone free childhood. It is my understanding that this organisation started amongst a group of concerned local parents and has now spread nationally. The talk was focused upon the benefits of children not having a smartphone with consideration of the impact of smart phones upon developing brains.

There is so much information out there and I know you will make your own decisions however I include some takeaways from the talk:

- We are proud to be a phone free school. Children do not and must not bring digital devices including phones, smartwatchs and ipads to school
- The Weald secondary school (who were present) has expressly stated that children do not need a smart phone for year 7
- The longer you can keep children away from smartphones the better for their mental health, social skills and education.
- They are not helpful to childhood and can actually put children at more risk than less

As a school I am happy with our position to be phone free. Part of my role as safeguarding lead is to highlight concern and direct parents to information that may be relevant. I am sure as concerned parents these issues are on your minds!

How to apply

If your child's date of birth is between 1 September 2021 and 31 August 2022 it is now time to apply for their school place. You need to apply online by visiting westsussex.gov.uk/admissions

Please be aware that the email address which you provide will be shared with your preference schools and allocated school, as parents and schools increasingly communicate electronically.

If you do not have access to the internet, free access to apply for a school place is available in all West Sussex libraries.

The website provides information needed for completing your application, including details of all the schools in West Sussex, your catchment school, if applicable, and important information for parents. Please read it carefully before making your application.

There are some benefits to applying online and we strongly advise all parents to do so. However, if you really can't access the internet you can obtain a paper form by calling 03330 142 903.

Please note, you must provide a valid email address with your application in order to receive the outcome of your school offer.

You must apply on time

It is very important that you apply before the closing date of **Thursday 15 January 2026**.

If your application is received after the closing date of **Thursday 15 January 2026** your chance of securing a place at one of your preference schools could be seriously affected.

Applications received after the closing date of **Thursday 15 January 2026** are late applications and will only be considered after all those that were received on time.

It is your responsibility as a parent to ensure that your application is received by the Pupil Admission Team on time.



Your preferences

We advise all parents to think very carefully about their three preferences and to use them wisely.

School places are allocated according to the published oversubscription criteria for that school. This can include criteria such as whether you live in the catchment area, whether there are siblings already at the school and the distance you live from the school.

Please be realistic in your preferences. You have a higher priority for local schools. If you chose an oversubscribed school, the further away you live the less likely you are to be offered a place.

Please note that personal circumstances, such as child care arrangements, are not part of the oversubscription criteria for any school and will not be taken into consideration.

Finally, we always advise parents to include their catchment school, if applicable, as one of their three preferences.

Cool Milk message

Dear parent/guardian,

As you may be aware your child's school has a milk scheme, administered by Cool Milk. Midmorning milk provides a much-needed nutritional boost and keeps children hydrated between breakfast and lunch. Children receive free milk until the age of 5. After that, they can continue to reap the benefits of fresh mid-morning milk at a subsidised* cost.

If you'd like to opt in and have not already done so, simply register your child at www.coolmilk.com/register. Your child(ren) will continue to receive free milk whilst under the age of 5 and Cool Milk will get in touch with further information by email shortly before their 5th birthday.

For children who are already over 5, it's not too late – our scheme is flexible! As well as being able to register and make payment straight away, you can join and cancel the scheme at any time. We offer yearly, termly and half termly payment periods and a recurring payment option to give you one less thing to remember.
