Assess Do Review

If your child is on our SEND register, they will have an Assess Do Review document which sets out the short-term targets that they are working on at school. Teachers are currently reviewing children's progress towards these targets and will shortly be sending out new targets. As part of this process, we ask you to complete a short parent voice questionnaire by the $16^{\rm th}$ June.

Your voice is important to us and will help us to meet your children's needs.

Statutory Tests

Few people like tests but they are an important benchmark. They are important for the school as they help with comparison against other schools however, they are also important for children as they are a means of demonstrating whether important building blocks of learning are in place.

This week year 4s have been tested on their times table knowledge, next week year 1 will be undertaking their phonics screening. I know they have worked hard to be prepared for them!

The children are familiar with the format of the tests, and we endeavour to ensure that the children are relaxed and happy when taking them.
