


English

- Different forms of poetry inspired by 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers
- Instructional Writing – 'Pudding Lane Cakes'
- Recount writing – inspired by Tuesday by David Wiesner
- Non-narrative – Links to history, information text, explanations.
- Grammar – Modal Verbs, adverbs, pronouns and fronted adverbials and relative clauses.



Maths

- Place value – Ones, tens, hundreds, thousands and tens of thousands. Compare and order 3 digit numbers, increasing to numbers up to 1,000,000.
- Mental and written methods – addition and subtraction
- Read Roman Numerals up to 1000
- Multiplication – times tables focus up to 12 x 12
- Multiplying and dividing by 10, 100
- Measurement – Length, Perimeter and Area
- Using the book 'Zero the Hero' to help with understanding of place value.



Physical Education

- **Speed, Agility and Quickness**
Building hand-eye coordination, body awareness and developing speed and strength.
- **Dance** – perform dances using a range of movement patterns
- **Volleyball** – developing simple tactics for attacking and defending



History

- A study of an aspect or theme in British history that extends pupils' chronological knowledge beyond 1066
- Understanding the conflict between monarchy and parliament during this period in History
- Learning about Significant events: Gunpowder Plot and Great Fire of London
- Comparing historical events
- Explore Britain at this time through role play
- Understand that language (either written or spoken) has changed over time and be able to distinguish past from present.
