


English

- Key Author – Shaun Tan
- Narrative Writing – inspired by 'The Lost Thing' by Shaun Tan
- Descriptive writing – The Dark by Lemony Snickett.
- Writing for a purpose in different genres such as diary writing, letters or recounts from the perspective of a character in our key texts
- Non-narrative – writing linked with topic (Science - Electricity) information text, explanations.
- GPS – structuring paragraphs, developing cohesions, use of commas, tenses, focus on prefixes and suffixes.



Maths

- Decimals – Adding and subtracting decimals within 1 and across a whole, Multiplying decimals by 10, 100 and 1000, adding and subtracting decimals with a different number of decimal places
- Properties of shape – identifying types of angles, triangles, horizontal and vertical, parallel and perpendicular. 2D and 3D shapes
- Converting units of measurement
- Geometry – position and direction, plotting and identifying co-ordinates
- Multiplication – continuing to develop quick fluency and transferable understanding of times tables, up to 12 x 12
